Bethel is registered with the University Council of Jamaica and has a Level 3 certification from the Church of God Education Department in Cleveland, Tennessee, USA.

Programme Offerings



- A four-year **Bachelor of Theology Degree** (accredited by the University Council of Jamaica) with minors in
 - Christian Education & Youth Ministries
 - Leadership Studies
 - Guidance & Counselling
- A three-year **Diploma in Theology** (accredited by the University Council of Jamaica)
- A one year **Certificate in Christian Ministry**.

Entry Requirements are - five (5) CSEC subjects or their equivalent in GCE for the Diploma and Degree programmes. Minimum requirement for the Certificate programme is secondary level education. Bethel's programmes are designed to equip students for specialized vocations, such as Christian Education, Youth Ministry, Leadership, Guidance and Counselling, and Lay Ministry.

The College operates five (5) Extension Units at which the Certificate in Christian Ministry is offered. These Centres are located in Portmore, Kingston, Port Antonio, Montego Bay and Lucea and provide flexible and accessible study opportunities for Christians desiring to deepen their understanding of their faith, sharpen their ministry skills and improve their life management skills.

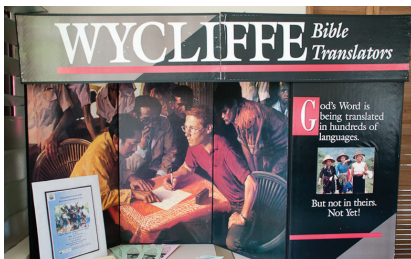
Bethel Celebration 2010
